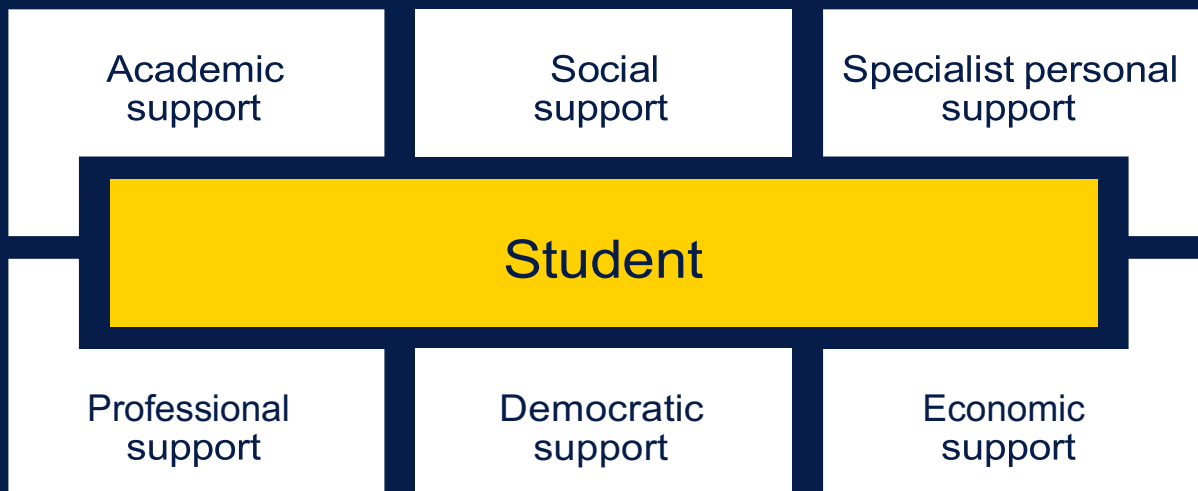


The Team around the ARUL Student

Academics with extensive professional / industry experience; iCentre; Technical Support Team via Zoom live chat and online MS Office and IT training classes; IT skills support on VLE and other essential IT services.
Specialist Personal support	Wellbeing, Disability & Inclusion Team (Student Wellbeing Advisor, Student Wellbeing Officer, Wellbeing Workshops, Counselling service); Wellbeing students' portal with online resources and communications; iCentre; Director of Studies Office; Academic Engagement Team; Students' Union Advice Service.
Economic support	Finance Department; Transport Bursary; 2 day week timetable¹; Top Achiever bursary; Achievement Scholarships; Kortext; Student Grants, Allowances, Discounts (including £2,000 discount for postgraduate study for our undergraduate alumni) and Benefits; Student Finance England (loans for undergraduate and postgraduate study); Office 365 (free Outlook, Word, Excel and PowerPoint software).
Social support	Students' Union social support , including fund for student extra-curricular projects; Student peer interaction & support ; including pair/group/team work; London campus with buildings in the East India Docks and convenient transport links; Multi-faith room; Student common spaces; Online chat room.
Democratic support	Students' Union representation support for a range of matters, including Student Representatives for every course and an ARU London Vice President as elected from and by the student body; regular feedback sessions, campaigns and focus groups. Student consultations, student feedback/ evaluations.
