

# Accommodation Guide for Students

Whilst we do not have any halls of residence on campus, we are able to direct you to our preferred partners who can offer various types of accommodation within easy travelling distance of ARU London.

In London there are many different types of Student Accommodation to suit every budget, style and preference. The main types of student accommodation consist of private student halls, house or flat shares, bedsits/studios and lodgings.

#### **Britannia Student Services**

Offer a wide range of student accommodation in London, with a choice of options to suit your needs.

#### **Apartments and House Shares:**

- Apartment prices may vary, depending on the location
- House shares range between £109-£179 per person per week.
- Minimum stay is 4 weeks and the minimum age is 18
- Stays should start and end on Saturday or Sunday

#### Rathbone Place:

- Prices are range from £207-£398 per person per week
- Located near Tottenham Court Road, two stops away from Chancery Lane underground
- Available all year round with self-catering facilities

### **Homestays and Private Homes in London:**

You can choose to live with a host.

- Prices range from £120-£200 per person per week, depending on the location
- London hosts are selected for their friendliness and their homes must meet British Council and English UK standards.

#### Halls of Residence:

Halls of residence are ideal for the students in their first year of university.

- Prices range between £180-£330 per person per week
- Located in the zone 1 and 2, near the underground stations
- Halls of residence:
  - 1. Britannia South Bank, with prices ranging from £180-£330 per person per week, located at 3 minutes' walk from Southwark (Jubilee Line).
  - 2. Tufnell House, with prices ranging from £282.00 per week for a en-suite room, located 4 minutes' walk from Tufnell Park underground station (Northern Line).
  - 3. International Hall, with prices ranging from £275 per person, per week for a Single room, located 3 minutes' walk from Russell Square station (Piccadilly Line).

With prices starting from £50 per room, per night.



# Accommodation for single parents

If you are not working or working on a low income, you may be able to get help with rent from the government.

If you choose to live with your family or friends, you can still claim benefits as a single parent.

If you rent from a private landlord, you may get help with rent cost by applying for housing benefits

Before committing to a tenancy, you may want to find out if you're able to get housing benefits or universal credit to help with the rent.

If you already receive housing benefit or universal credit you may qualify for a discretionary housing payment from your local council to help to pay a deposit/rent in advance/removal costs. This does not have to be repaid.

If you receive income-related benefits like jobseeker's allowance, you may qualify for a budgeting loan from Jobcentre Plus to pay rent in advance. The loan is repayable and must be repaid within a two-year period, but no interest is charged.
