

Guide: How to access your feedback

C: Finding feedback for presentations


A. Locating your feedback in the right tile

Feedback for both coursework and presentations is available on the VLE.

To find feedback, you will need to:

- 1. Log into the VLE.
- 2. Go to the correct module tile.
- T1 = September December
- T2 = January May
- T3 = May August


For example, if you submitted your Academic & Professional Skills coursework in November, you will need to go to the **T1**_Academic & Professional Skills tile to find your feedback.




B. Accessing Feedback for Coursework


Feedback for coursework is available in the Turnitin link.

- 1. Find the correct tile.
- 2. Click on 'Assessments & Assessment Guidance'.
- 3. Click on the Turnitin submission link.



4. It is possible there may be multiple submission links in different sections. If this is the case, click on all the links until you see your coursework. For example, let's click on Section 1:

It says 'you have no active papers in this assignment', so the work is not there. Click in the bottom right corner to look in Section 2.




Now we can see the work. The grade is 76 and the similarity score is 25%.

5. Click on the document's title to look at the feedback.




6. The feedback studio will open in a new window. Click on the blue speech bubble to reveal your feedback.



7. Scroll down to see comments in blue on your work. You can click on the blue boxes for more information and detail.



8. For overall feedback, look in the box on the right hand side. You can click 'View Rubric' for more detail.



The rubric will open in a new window, with more comments.



Notably, these include a diverse range of high quality institutional reports. You have also used paraphrase/summary in an outstanding, clear way. Your use of Harvard referencing near flawless. However, please note that secondary citations should not be listed in the final reference list. Instead, simply list the source you've read once on the list. To improve your Use of Sources score, look to engage more with peer reviewed academic literature as this script only cites one (mandatory) journal article. Work on using multiple sources to support one point. |


C. Accessing Feedback for Presentations
